CITY COUNCIL/RURAL FIRE MEETING MINUTES

NOVEMBER 11TH, 2015

Members of the City Council of the City of Crawford, Nebraska, met in special session in the Crawford Fire Hall, 220 Elm Street, Crawford, Nebraska on the 11th day of November, 2015, at 7:00 o'clock p.m. The following individuals were present: Mayor Nixon and Council Member Norgard. Absent: Attorney Edmund, Council Members Kuhnel, Adams and Chubb. There was not a quorum present.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by posting at three locations: City Hall, D & S Market and the US Post Office, as certified and filed in the City Clerk's office at City Hall. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice of the Mayor and City Council of this meeting. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Mayor Nixon called the meeting to order and declared a quorum present at 7:00 p.m. and announced to the public that a copy of the Open Meetings Act is posted on the wall in the Crawford Fire Hall. It is also available in pamphlet form.

Crawford City Council approved the drafted Agreement for Fire Protection Services at the November 10, 2015 council meeting, conditional upon securing the legal description for the ground by the park entrance. It was stated that Harris Snyder might have information on that property north of the park entrance.

The Rural Board would like the following amendment to the Agreement: #4 - D on page 3, add "at no cost to the DISTRICT" to the end of D.

Inland Truck estimates the repairs to the pumper truck to be \$15,000, including making it a 4WD with a proper gear ratio (\$7,500 city cost, \$7,500 rural cost). Firefighters feel it is important to have 4WD for year-round access to all areas of town. This should make the pumper truck serviceable for several more years.

Another concern for future funding is the siren warning system. Region 23 may have information on grants and FEMA money available for warning systems. USDA may also have some funding available.
