


CITY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING MINUTES

JULY 11TH, 2017

Members of the City Council of the City of Crawford, Nebraska, met in regular session in the City Hall Council Chambers, 135 Elm Street, Crawford, Nebraska on the 11th day of July, 2017, at 6:30 o'clock p.m. The following individuals were present: Mayor David Nixon, Attorney Adam Edmund, Council Member Ed Kuhnel, Council Member Connie Shell, Council Member Roy Norgard and Council Member Larry Olson. Absent: none.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publishing in The Crawford Clipper/Harrison Sun as shown by the affidavit of publication filed in the City Clerk's office at City Hall. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice of the Mayor and City Council of this meeting. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

 Mayor Nixon called the meeting to order and declared a quorum present at 6:30 p.m. and announced to the public that a copy of the Open Meetings Act is posted on the wall in the Council Chambers. It is also available in pamphlet form.

Council Member Shell made a motion to approve the minutes of the June 27, 2017 regular council meeting. The motion was seconded by Council Member Olson. The following Council Members voted AYE: Shell, Olson, Norgard and Kuhnel. Council Members voted NAY: None. Motion carried.

Board Reports:

Golf: minutes from 7-10-17 meeting were available; discussing a website for the golf course separate from the city website.

Park: minutes from 7-10-17 meeting were available; new signs at the pool; heater is not working right but is getting some parts replaced; attendance numbers are up; request moving cemetery employees to the park to help park employee; complaints of people dumping in the wood chip area but it is cabled off now; Wacipi event will be held July 21 and 22.

Ponderosa Villa: 28 in nursing; 8 in assisted-living; CNA class is being offered 7-11-17; lost \$713 in May.

Hospital: will have a special meeting next Monday.


SWANN: meet 7-20-17.

Fire: no report.

Rodeo: meet 7-11-17.

NNDC: meet 7-21-17.

Chamber of Commerce: Eclipse t-shirts are available.

 Sub-committee for use of Cultural Center: toured upper level of building, which is in sad shape; not suitable for use; there are pigeon carcasses, window out; roof doesn't appear to be leaking, but not suitable for storage; Jim Hanson will assess the building.

The first reading of Ordinance 660 amending Water Rental Rates / Readiness-to-Service was read by Council Member Shell.

Council Member Shell made a motion to approve the intern Cambrea Vogel at the Public Library. The motion was seconded by Council Member Olson. The following Council Members voted AYE: Shell, Olson, Kuhnel and Norgard. Council Members voted NAY: None. Motion carried.

Council Member Kuhnel made a motion to approve to post emergency 10 mph signs on Second Street between Pine and First Street. The motion was seconded by Council Member Shell. The following Council Members voted AYE: Kuhnel, Shell, Norgard and Olson. Council Members voted NAY: None. Motion carried.

Council Member Kuhnel made a motion to approve the wage of \$12.93 for Cindy Drinkwalter. The motion was seconded by Council Member Olson. The following Council Members voted AYE: Kuhnel, Olson, Shell and Norgard. Council Members voted NAY: None. Motion carried.

No action was taken on health insurance. Council Members Shell and Olson will look into Level-funding and the GAP plan before deciding if Requests for Proposal wish to be sought.

Council Member Norgard made a motion to approve advertising for fuel bids (bulk unleaded, bulk non-highway diesel, pump highway diesel, pump premium unleaded, pump unleaded and propane). The motion was seconded by Council Member Shell. The following Council Members voted AYE: Norgard, Shell, Kuhnel and Olson. Council Members voted NAY: None. Motion carried.

Council Member Kuhnel made a motion to approve the building permit for Gary Homrighausen for a fence at 1010 Fifth Street. The motion was seconded by Council Member Olson. The following Council Members voted AYE: Kuhnel, Olson, Norgard and Shell. Council Members voted NAY: None. Motion carried.

Council Member Kuhnel made a motion to approve the bid from Paul Reed Construction & Supply for \$110,648.02 for the water and waste water extension for the new Fire Hall, contingent on USDA and RD approval. The motion was seconded by Council Member Norgard. The following Council Members voted AYE: Kuhnel, Norgard, Shell and Olson. Council Members voted NAY: None. Motion carried.

Council Member Kuhnel made a motion to approve the subdivision of Bock 15, Lot 5, Paddocks Addition – Elizabeth Domingo. The motion was seconded by Council Member Shell. The following Council Members voted AYE: Kuhnel, Shell, Olson and Norgard. Council Members voted NAY: None. Motion carried.

Council Member Kuhnel made a motion to approve the building permit for a pad with roof for Dan Bean at 303 Reed Street. The motion was seconded by Council Member Norgard. The following Council Members voted AYE: Kuhnel, Norgard, Olson and Shell. Council Members voted NAY: None. Motion carried.

Deputy Swickard reported for May: 152 complaints including a couple misdemeanors, 13 animal complaints, 3 traffic, 23 warnings, 6 paper-service, 2 assist-other-agencies, 8 motorist-assists, 4 rescue, 3 coroner, 5 large parties and 1 domestic disturbance. For June: 116 complaints, including 3 misdemeanors, 7 animal complaints, 3 accidents, 6 paper-service, 5 assist-other-agencies, 5 motorist-assists, 1 fire, 1 rescue, 2 party, 2 domestic disturbances.


Bills and claims received approval of three Council Members as indicated by their signatures.


