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CITY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING MINUTES

JULY 10TH, 2018

Members of the City Council of the City of Crawford, Nebraska, met in regular session in the City Hall Council Chambers, 135 Elm Street, Crawford, Nebraska on the 10th day of July, 2018, at 6:30 o'clock p.m. The following individuals were present: Mayor David Nixon, Attorney Adam Edmund, Council Member Ed Kuhnel, Council Member Roy Norgard, Council Member Connie Shell and Council Member Larry Olson. Absent: none.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publishing in The Crawford Clipper/Harrison Sun as shown by the affidavit of publication filed in the City Clerk's office at City Hall. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice of the Mayor and City Council of this meeting. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Mayor Nixon called the meeting to order and declared a quorum present at 6:30 p.m. and announced to the public that a copy of the Open Meetings Act is posted on the wall in the Council Chambers. It is also available in pamphlet form.

Council Member Shell made a motion to approve the minutes of the June 26, 2018 regular council meeting. The motion was seconded by Council Member Olson. The following Council Members voted AYE: Shell, Olson, Kuhnel and Norgard. Council Members voted NAY: None. Motion carried.

Board Reports:

Golf: will meet 7-16-18.

Ponderosa Villa: 26 in nursing home and 4 with Medicare Part A; 11 in assisted-living; lost \$3,866 in May.

Sub-Committee for use of Cultural Center: John Erixson would like Larry Olson to meet with the roofers when they arrive; museum has not been open as much due to health issues; looking for volunteers.

Vehicle Committee: it was stated that in reference to the 6x6, Bob Hardy said just selling it for parts should take care of the problem with the serial number.

Deputy Swickard reported that the 4th of July holiday went well and thanked the City for their assistance.

It was reported that the Planning Commission had tabled a recommendation until they can visit with the City Attorney on the conditional use application submitted by Pat Bergin to scrap and dismantle cars at 219 Second Street, so the Council took no action.

Council Member Norgard made a motion to approve \$400 from Rock Swap to cover vendor and camping fees, with campers hooking up to RV spaces paying extra in addition. The motion was seconded by Council

Member Olson. The following Council Members voted AYE: Norgard, Olson, Shell and Kuhnel. Council Members voted NAY: None. Motion carried.

Council Member Kuhnel made a motion to approve the appointments to the Board of Health as Mayor Nixon, Council President Connie Shell, Deputy Scott Swickard and Fire Chief Brian Prosser. The motion was seconded by Council Member Norgard. The following Council Members voted AYE: Kuhnel, Norgard, Olson and Shell. Council Members voted NAY: None. Motion carried.

Council Member Norgard made a motion to approve the attendance of Cindy Drinkwalter to the BraunAbility workshop (regarding wheelchair lifts) in Scottsbluff September 27, 2018. The motion was seconded by Council Member Shell. The following Council Members voted AYE: Norgard, Shell, Kuhnel and Olson. Council Members voted NAY: None. Motion carried.

Council Member Shell made a motion to approve to advertise for fuel bids (bulk unleaded, bulk diesel, pump diesel, pump premium, pump unleaded and propane). The motion was seconded by Council Member Olson. The following Council Members voted AYE: Shell, Olson, Norgard and Kuhnel. Council Members voted NAY: None. Motion carried.

Workshops are scheduled to discuss city buildings and property for Tuesdays July 17 and July 31 at 6:30 pm at the old Fire Hall at 220 Elm Street.

Levi Grant cautioned the Council on the process of selling military vehicles.


